2. Confirmation of notes of previous KCCCC meeting of 26 September 2019

The notes to the last committee meeting were accepted.

3. Actions completed from last minutes:

- Industrial Park consultation process,

Council Dam Proposal – web link circulated. Council to present at this meeting 7pm

- NVMP subcommittee determine outcome

- Native veg – HS talking to landholders regarding potential sites on private property to create linkages to remnants and reveg sites.

- CD creating template for application to address criteria.
- Community Action List (CAL) updated by CD and distributed with last minutes (26 Sept)
- Native Veg Council request from CD for information on Bald Hills SEB Offset.
- Update Community Action Plan – CD
 - Community Action Plan updated to reflect discussions in 2019 regarding revisions to the PEPR and added to KCCCC website.
- NVC information to CB from DEW
CD requested information from Adam Schutze (DEW), but no response to date.

ACTION

CD to follow up with DEW.

- Launch of master plan at Callington Show
 - The Master Plan was launched at the Callington Show. Many positive comments were received on the day.
 - In addition, despite not receiving a formal award at the 2019 Premiers Award, the submission made by the KCCCC was recognised by Paul Hethersay (CEO of Dept. Energy and Mining) in a letter of congratulations. Well done to everybody.
- Concerns with how plan was being used – specifically in regard to the rezoning application
 - The following link to DPA for re-zoning application was provided to KCCCC prior to meeting.

 - FC raised concerns that:
 - The Master Plan was being misused and misrepresented in the Council rezoning application for Urban Employment.
 - The Pillars of the Master Plan had been cherry picked and applied in isolation so the holistic approach of the plan is not represented and there seemed to be too much focus on economic development. Any development plan must consider all 4 pillars of the plan.
 - HS – does not necessarily agree with that assessment, and reminded everybody that the development plan amendment is just first step with other steps to follow before any definite development.
 - GD – Master Plan (Community Aspiration) must not be picked through to support development that does not achieve all pillars “This seems to be missed by council and the media”
 - LW – highlighted that the Master Plan specifically references the use of the site as an industrial park post closure and that the rezone application was a step towards this. He noted that Urban Employment restricts certain industry.
 - KM – Opportunity to develop a response which references Master Plan appropriately as a response to the community consultation process.
 - CS – But what about alternative, that enrich the local area instead of more of the same (dusty, dirty ,noisy) e.g.; Arts/History etc....

ACTION

Establish sub-committee to work on the submission on behalf of the KCCCC. Volunteers for Sub Committee to generate submission: KM, FC, GD, ET, CB, HS, KS

4. Kanmantoo Copper Mine Update

- Compliance / Emission
 - No Exceedance of PEPR criteria since last meeting
 - Regional “dust” event 20th a& 21st Nov – fire smoke & dust haze
 - Mine response to enforce TARP regardless of mine not being the cause
- Time line for operations at Kanmantoo
 - Pit completed in May 2019
 - Processing continues until approximately March/April 2020. After this point the processing facility will be on care and maintenance as exploration opportunities are evaluated.
 - Progressive rehabilitation continues – next campaign will occur between March and May 2020
- Beyond 2020
 - Underground development. Still awaiting confirmation of minimum mining period from AGL. All other studies progressing well.

5. Exploration areas of immediate focus

- South Hub
- North West & Stella (near Mine)

6. Hanson

- Sarah Bellman update on status of operation
- Operational change – drop in council work & projects, as well as the Kanmantoo quarry reaching its maximum permitted footprint has caused the workforce to be reduced.
- 7 Employees to finish after 3 months’ notice all want to come back when quarry re-opens
- Still open for sales of existing stockpiles
- Operation not closed still producing bluestone
- New export partnership for high-end supplies to Dubai / Turkey benchtops etc....
- Open day in October was very successful
- Hanson are working through the approvals process to expand operational footprint.
- 800 year mine life in proposal each pit rehabilitated when next pit started
- Polymer covered stockpile to reduce dust
- Future water supply via recycled water pipeline
- Proctor Road upgrade Princes Highway to Sawpit Gully Road in combination with council to be sealed
- Proctor Road responsibility of council to maintain
- Trucks diverting onto Nursery Road a few weeks ago – Sarah said to report all incursions onto local roads to the Quarry general phone number 85385155.

7. Proposed Council Recycling Water Storage Facility

- Lot 25 earmarked for possible storage as part of original water agreement in 2010.
- DCMB Presentation
 - Community information forums. Brian Clancy, Grazio Maiorano (URPS), Borvin Kracman (Independent Consultant)
 - Outline – to be owned and operated by the council. Propose to maximise productive use of recycled water.
 - Planned construction commencing Autumn 2020
 - Council to secure approvals and funding
 - Where – Lot 25 Back Callington Road

- Planning approval lodgement with DPTI
- Assessment against development plan policy
- Referral on to Government departments
- Community comments (15 business days)
- Brian Clancy can answer questions during the process
- DPTI & SCAP finalise assessment then provide advice to the minister
- Minister then makes final decision

Question from the gallery- What would this project look like?

- Capacity for 1000 mega litres
 - 1 or 2 cells (ponds) depending on final design
 - Maximum size 480 x 400 metres x 12 deep
 - Lined with plastic & geotextile & clay
 - Underdrains & leak protection
 - No overland flow into storage
 - Security and animal fencing
 - Embankment planted with pasture
